### Call for Applications: Researcher, Geriatric Palliative Care at the Lausanne University Hospital, Switzerland

*The vacant position is placed in the context of research and policy work on advance care planning (ACP). In a project funded by the Swiss Academy of Medical Sciences, a disease-specific ACP program for patients with early Alzheimer's Disease will be developed in close collaboration with partners in the United States, culturally adapted and piloted in the French-speaking region of Switzerland.
