### Competition – Visiting Scholar in Neuroethics 2016-2017

Neuroethics Research Unit – Institut de recherches cliniques de Montréal, IRCM

This program aims to provide early-career and established researchers from any disciplinary background with the opportunity to engage in neuroethics research within a dynamic environment. Applicants will submit proposals for a research project to be completed during a one- to two-month stay with the Neuroethics Research Unit of the IRCM in Montréal, Canada.

#### Competition Details

We are seeking applications from both national and international scholars (advanced graduate students or those with a professional or doctoral degree) who have a strong interest in undertaking research in neuroethics. While no formal neuroethics experience is required, applicants must propose a research project that can make an original contribution to the field. All visiting scholars must be able to work on their research with minimal supervision and priority will be given to candidates who demonstrate an interest in building a collaborative project with members of the Neuroethics Research Unit.

Visiting scholars will have their return travel to Montreal covered (up to \$1500 CAD) and will receive a taxable stipend of \$750-1500 CAD. Scholars are asked to propose an appropriate length of stay (1 to 2 months). As visiting members of the Neuroethics Research Unit, they will receive a dedicated workspace, take part in weekly Journal Club meetings, and will be expected to deliver a minimum of 2 lectures on the topic of their research through the Montreal Neuroethics Network. Further, they will also be expected to contribute writing on the topic of their research to *Brainstorm*, the Unit's monthly newsletter on neuroscience, ethics, and society.

Submission of applications: March 15<sup>th</sup>-June 15<sup>th</sup>, 2016

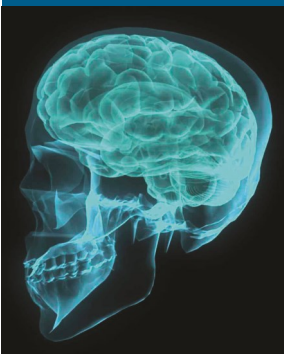
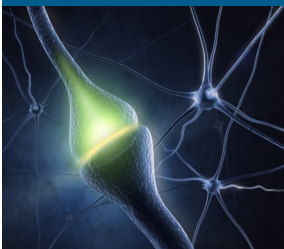

Only shortlisted applicants will be contacted. The successful applicant will be responsible for ensuring they meet the requirements to enter Canada.

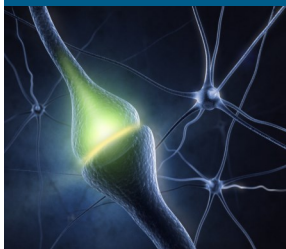

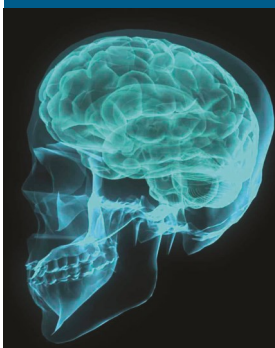
