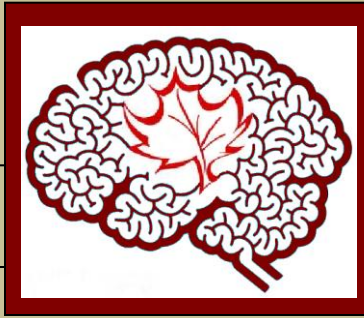

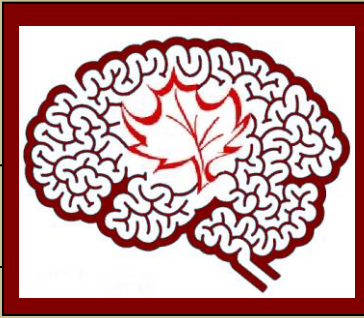

The Berlin School of Mind and Brain is a graduate school based at the Humboldt-Universität zu Berlin. It has been funded by Germany's Excellence Initiative since being established in 2006. The school provides a very successful English-language doctoral degree program which brings together the neurosciences, psychology, philosophy and linguistics.
